

Course Information: Medical University of Graz

Please note that all courses and exams are only offered in German! Therefore you need a profound knowledge of the German language (minimum: B1), before you come to Graz.

When applying for Human Medicine, please consider the following regulations:

One semester stays:

You can do **2 modules (PM) and 1 special study module (SSM)** at our university. However, you must choose at least 4 modules and 2 SSMs out of which you will be assigned 2 modules and 1 SSM.

Two semester stays:

You can do **4 modules (PM) and 2 special study modules (SSM)** at our university. However, you must choose at least 6 modules and 3 SSMs out of which you will be assigned 4 modules and 2 SSMs.

Modules consist of **lectures**, **seminars** and **practical classes**. In seminars and practical classes attendance is compulsory. **Exams** take place after each module.

Please indicate what would be your first and second priority. You need to know that you could also be assigned your second priority though.

Therefore, please only choose modules that will be accredited for at your home university.

It is NOT possible to change your study plan after the application deadline.

If you wish to do clinical rotations instead of PMs or SSMs, please indicate that already in the Learning Agreement. You can also do additional clinical rotations during the holidays upon availability - please make sure that those clinical rotations are also included in the Learning Agreement.

Moreover, there is a wide range of elective courses offered at the Medical University of Graz. Since the offer of elective courses is only scheduled at the beginning of the semester, you could choose those subjects once you are in Graz and change your Learning Agreement accordingly.
